August Club Celebrity - Teena Medwin



"How did I get involved in the club?....Well, we went to National Trial in 1985 Dean had always had an interest in watching the trials; he says he never had enough guts to compete, until a chat with Cruisey 'infected' him, and for me the interest in wheels had always been there - pre-kids I used to ride an XR100 on holidays down the West Coast, and I now own a Red Mini Cooper S".

Dean started competing in late 1999 and he used to chat on about his day and all the riders, I used to go along but didn't know anyone and hadn't a clue really so I decided to observe to get to know everyone. That worked, and I progressed from there to being club Treasurer for 3 years."

After seeing the observers battling with the old-style soggy score-sheets of paper on rainy days, and noting the much better system at the mainland Nats where waterproof plastic cards were punched,

Teena organised this system for the club, combining it with the lap-top for accurate and instant results at the end of the day's riding. She must have been on a roll after this, organising the club merchandise such as T-shirts caps and jumpers.

Career-wise Teena was a dental nurse for 6 years, a bank teller for 5, back to dental nursing for 3 years, then 3 years in a jeweler shop, and is now working again as a dental nurse at the same practice after a 25 year break. She also taught and coached swimming for 13 years, and although we all had a smile at the cheeky reference to Teena's bedside whistle in the last newsletter, its origins date back to her Swimming Teaching & Coaching days. During that time she instructed water babies as young as 6 months to an elderly lady who was 86yrs old and also coached competitive swimmers at State Level. Instructions on how to find the next trial at Cokers Road near Mathinna

How to get to there is a bit more complex than usual, although most riders have probably already been there before & so won't be too fazed.

If coming from Launceston or the North West Coast, you can follow instructions from Point A. Don't rely on the C grade markers though, as the following notes were written for a previous trial & the markers will probably be long gone. As if that wasn't enough the road past Upper Blessington has been closed due to major roadworks, but we think it is probably open again now. So the northerners have three choices – go straight on at Upper Blessington & pray that the road is not closed, turn left at Upper Blessington & follow the C401 (quite a few bends), or play safe & go via Fingal (Fingal to Mathinna is a good sealed road & virtually straight).

For the southerners, head for Fingal & then follow the instructions at the bottom of the page.

These instructions commence at Point A on the maps, point A is the centre of the hamlet of St Leonards approx 8kms ESE of Launceston. There will be C-Grade markers on all the intersections from point A, if you don't see a marker don't turn!!

For travellers from the North West Coast we suggest taking the Hobart/Kings Meadows entry to the Midland Hwy at Prospect, then travel 1.6 km south and take the Kings Meadows connector, if you follow this all the way through as it changes from Kings Meadows Connector to Quarantine Rd to Johnson's Rd you will be at point A


From Point A travel (approx) 40 kms along Blessington Rd C401 until you reach Upper Blessington.

Travel straight on past the C401 Mathinna sign and follow Roses Tier Rd approx 10 km until you rejoin, TURN RIGHT onto C401 Gunns Rd.(signed Upper Esk)


Travel a further (approx) 10kms until you reach a T-Junction Upper Esk Rd

Turn LEFT and travel a further 3.5 kms, keep RIGHT onto small wooden bridge then turn LEFT into Cokers Rd
Travel carefully approx 1.5kms to trial site!

For those travelling from Hobart simply turn Left at Fingal to Mathinna, travel 1.5kms and turn Right onto Mathinna Rd travel 24 kms to the Mathinna cross roads continue another 15kms to the start of the dirt, (road to Laun on left) then follow the above instructions from the star.



If coming from Hobart – the route via Fingal looks the best option.



If coming from Launceston or the northeast, check out above notes.
