Acting President's Report

Greetings to all members and friends of the Tasmanian Motorcycle Trials Club.

With the club's August event being held early to allow members to compete in the Victorian Championships, it has been some time since we have published a newsletter, and much has occurred in the meantime.

During August, the Victorian and Australian championships were held, at Sedgwick and Pacific Park respectively. Chris Bayles competed in the experts class in both events, finishing 5th in the Australian titles before travelling to Europe to ride in two world championship rounds and then in the Trial des Nations. The Australian men's team in the Trial des Nations, comprised of Chris Bayles, Kyle Middleton, Tim Coleman and Colin Zarczynski, finished 3rd in the International Trophy behind The Czech Republic and Germany. I am sure that all members of TMTC will join me in congratulating Chris and his team mates for achieving this great result.

The women's team in the Trial des Nations, comprising Kristie McKinnon, Ina Halls and Kaitlin Cummins were placed 8th in the women's division.

Back home, the latest round of the TMTC's club championship was held at Mt Joy on 20 September. A strong entry of 38 riders competed in various grades on a fine, if not always warm, day. There are now only two more events before the close of the series, at Oatlands on 18 October and Eugenana on 15 November.

As previously advised, the AGM of the club will be held at the Oatlands. Our club requires an active band of people to make things happen. Volunteers for all and any positions in the club are welcome. Please give that some thought as we approach the AGM and form a new committee for 2016.

It has become apparent that there is a shortage of used trials bikes for sale, not just in Tasmania, but also throughout the country. This shortage is expected to ease when the new models from several manufacturers arrive within the next month or two and older bikes are then traded in. Meanwhile, the club is aware that there are potential competitors looking to purchase used bikes in order to enter the sport. Event wrap up

I promise no weird delusional alien stories here. I have no idea what was going on in my head when I wrote that. Maybe the idea of two events in a row at Mt Joy melted my brain in excitement. Who knows? Anyway, moving on...

It's great to see the club continuing to grow, there were more new faces at this event, just like the last one, and the one before that. Not only do we have brand new riders, we've got some up and coming young riders who keep improving and will be names to watch in the future. Young Billy Berne is looking as good on a bike as his Granddad, and Broc isn't far behind him. Further up the field Jordan Perkins and Josh Lockhart are mixing it with the best in C+ and could be eyeing off the yellow lines soon. Bradley Shadbolt is riding very well in A grade, so who knows how far these three young men can go? For a small club like ours, we're doing alright, and I wouldn't be surprised if any of those three are trying to take on Chris Bayles in a few years. No pressure or anything guys.

Just about everyone knows the Tassie Titles site at Mt Joy. Rocks galore, slippery shale, some decent sized logs and a man-made section too. We're spoilt for choice there and the section setters did a great job mixing some old and new areas together. You'll never please everyone all the time, or possibly almost none of the C+ riders on section 6, but overall everyone seemed to enjoy the day.

As I mentioned before, Billy Berne rode impressively to score the win in the juniors, dropping just two points all day. Broc took second place, Keira finished in third while Jamie finished fourth in his second ride with the club.

David Quinn was our sole Clubman rider, who lost only 4 points. Rumour has it he was spotted riding a C grade line, maybe a move up is on the cards?

The Suzuki piloted by Mick Luscombe took the Twin Shock victory, with a score that would have been 5 better if it didn't run out of fuel.

C grade was huge, 17 riders! Low scores at the pointy end of the field resulted in a couple of countbacks and some very close results. Low scores make it very tight, an errant 3 could have knocked you back from a podium finish to 9th. Neil Berne felt none of this pressure with a score of 2. Mike Travica grabbed second place two points behind, and President Hosking found himself in third place on 6 points.

Seven riders set out in C+, Ian Pickering taking third place. Second went to Nigel Munday, who is hopefully feeling much better after a big crash on section 6 which threatened to ruin the near new Sherco and his shoulder. Peter Bayles cruised in for the win.

It was a tough day to be a B grader. Mike Amey took on the rocks and came out with the win on 70 points. Kieran Clay was only 5 points behind, Kyle Buckley rounded out the three.

Seven points covered the top 3 in A grade. Leo Rochfort finished the day, without having to borrow a second bike, on 26 points. Fellow Ossa rider Kurt Pickering came in second, Peter Lockhart in third place.

It's the Southerners turn to set one, and it'll be at Oatlands on the 18th of October. It's always a good venue and well worth getting along to. Finally, the Ulysses club is holding their AGM in Tasmania next year in the week leading up to our Tasmanian Titles and have asked for us to do a demonstration there. Again, more information on that will be available later
