# Supplementary information for TMTC members assisting the Come-and-Try day on 27 August 2017. Format of the event.

- Four sections of clubman C and easy C+ level will be used for the event. These sections have been set out in the usual manner, ie a boundary tape with splits denoted by green, blue and yellow arrows (the yellow arrows have been used for the C+ line). The sections have been set in close proximity to each other.
- The sections will be used to enable participants to try a variety of trials bikes brought to the event by their owners.
- In order to comply with insurance conditions relating to club events, all bikes to be used in the event must be scutineered prior to the commencement of the event
- The sections have been set in a grassy valley in order to minimise the potential for damage to participants and bikes in the event of falls.
- The bikes and their owners will be distributed over the four sections. The owner and his/her bike will remain together. The owners may wish to move from section to section with their bike consistent with keeping a similar number of bikes on each section.
- As a general rule, bikes must remain in the vicinity of the sections. There may be an opportunity for members to ride further afield following the conclusion of the official event, subject to the permission of the Southern Junior Dirt Bike Club.
- At the commencement of the morning and afternoon sections, all participants will gather at section 1 for a demonstration of how to ride a section. Participants will then move from section to section on foot.
- During the interval between the morning and afternoon sections, Chris Bayles will provide a demonstration` of top-level trials riding in the vicinity of the sections.

#### **Program and timing**

- Members are asked to arrive by 9:00am in order to have their bike unloaded and ready for Scrutineering by 9:30.
- Members are requested to park in the parking area adjacent to the club building. However, a limited number of vehicles that are required to transport gear associated with the event (dealer tents, event equipment etc) will be able to cross the short distance to the valley where the sections have been set. All other members should ride their bike slowly to the scrutineering area. Helmets must be worn at all times when bikes are ridden.
- 9:30am: Members and participants' sign on. The official tent will be positioned near section 1.
- Scrutineering opens at 9:30
- 10:15am: Welcome from Club President Chris Bayles followed by a briefing of participants and members
- 10:30am: Brief demonstration of trials technique and trials signage at section 1 followed by participants beginning to ride the sections.
- 12:15pm: morning session ends, sign on for afternoon participants begins
- 12:30pm: Demonstration by Chris Bayles
- 1:00pm: break for lunch
- 1:30pm: welcome and briefing for afternoon participants followed by section riding
- 3:00pm: afternoon session closes. Members may wish to assist in dismantling the sections and packing up.
- Naturally, there is no entry fee for TMTC members who assist with this event!
