

On Sunday 18th October, SQTA had the privilege of hosting the 4th and final round of the AMA Qld Interclub Series. For those that may not know, this was the first ever AMA Trials Interclub Series which kicked off back in March with Rd 1 hosted by Logan River Motorcycle Trials Club. Round 2 was hosted by Trials Club of Qld. Rounds 3 & 4 were planned to be hosted by Central Qld Trials Club but unfortunately the covid situation made that not possible. The 3 clubs in LRMTC, TCQ and SQTA joined forces to then co-host Round 3 on behalf of CQTC.

It was only a few months ago that SQTA held an event at John Hinchcliffe's property on the B side, but it was an ideal property to run this event. The only thing missing from this little piece of trials paradise is a bit of water and mud. It's been so dry, the powdery surface made getting traction in some sections a bit tricky for the not so skilled participants. Probably fair to say it took some points of a few upper grade riders as well.

The Friday beforehand saw a small group of volunteers get a head start by setting 6 sections close to the camping area. Saturday there was an impressive turnout to set the last 6 sections, making a nice loop of 12 sections. Grades T2 down to T4 rode all 12 sections, while a couple of the sections were thought to be a bit challenging for T5 & T6 so their course was reduced to 10 sections. As it was expected to be quite a warm day and with a field of 60+ riders, the event was run over 3 laps. After an observer briefing and then a riders briefing, riding got under way just prior to 10am with a planned finish by 4pm, or sooner if everyone gets their 3 laps finished. The riders at this event were treated to an observer on every section, putting the "observed" back into observed trials, something we haven't seen for a little while. As the day went on and the temperature reached the mid 20's, it was quite comfortable in the shade but any time spent in the sun soon had you sweating. Riding was all wrapped around 2.30ish and after sections were pulled in and some packing up was done, the complimentary sqtadogs were ready to serve. After a quick feed and a drink it on to the presentations for both the day and the overall series place getters.



As this was the final round of the AMA Interclub Series, there was quite a bit of bling on display for the riders to see what they were competing for. There were medallions on offer for the first 1st to 3rd on the day in each grade, with some very nice trophies up for grabs for those in a position to take out a series podium with a good ride on the day.

As for the scoring, I won't give too much detail here as there are full result sheets for both the final round and overall scores with this report. There are some things worth a mention though. T2 Red plate had 6 riders with Kale Reed taking out the day almost 50pts clear of 2nd place. T3 Yellow plate there was only 1pt between 1st and 2nd place with Justin Gough just pipping Richard Kent. T5 White plate was the largest field with 24 riders with Mark Hall pipping Cliff Ludhe by just 1pt and just 13pts separating the top ten places. The ride of the day would have to be Harry Laun riding T5 Junior Small Wheel on just 9 pts for the day (yes you read correctly, 9pts!) which was a good enough score to not only win T5 Junior Large Wheel but also take 1st in T5 Senior, Harry you're a little legend but stop it, your embarrassing us grown ups ©©© Mason Pugh and Dylan Long riding T5 Junior Large Wheel also had outstanding rides with Mason taking the Iollies by just 2 pts over Dylan and both on scores that would have seen them get 1st in T5 Senior. There were some excellent rides by all the junior riders so trials in Qld is looking very healthy indeed. Kudos to all the section setters for setting a course to take points off even the best in each grade yet allow the field to keep scores pretty close.

For the overall series results, a couple of points worthy of a mention. T2 Red plate 1st and 2nd place are both young guns of the sport in Billy Gough and Jake Long respectively, we're sure you two will have many battles in the years to come, well done fellas. T4 Blue plate after 4 rounds there were two riders level on series points, with Eden Feehely taking 1st place over Gareth Teale in 2nd place by countback, any unnecessary dabs come to mind now Gareth ©©

The scoring for the day, as well as the series points were handled by Cherie Pugh and Shaylene Clark. The ladies did a fantastic job making presentation a smooth affair. SQTA and I'm sure the other clubs would concur in saying a massive thanks to you both for doing such a great job, it's really appreciated.
